OMNILORE PROFILES

Burt Cutler

Los Angeles-born Burt Cutler, who left high school before graduation to enter the ASTP program during World War II and then enrolled in a course of engineering study at Stanford University which bypassed a bachelor's degree and led directly to a master's degree in electrical engineering, knew from the start that his concentration on technological studies would lead to a success in the technical world. But it wasn't until a few years ago that he realized he had missed out on the humanities.

With a vision of pursuing the world of non-technical knowledge he had not had time for during his college years, he decided to start a study-discussion group for other adults with inquiring minds. The result was OMNILORE, which started a few years ago with a handful of interested persons from the South Bay who met first in one another's homes and later in the Board Room of Malaga Cove Savings and Loan. In order to

have an opportunity to offer more than one choice of study-discussion topics per semester, the group decided to expand. With the help of Ethel Allen and others, the group received the backing of Cal State Dominguez, and opened to the community-at-large early in 1992.

Currently semi-retired, Burt set up his own business while working at Gilfillan Corporation in Los Angeles. Starting as a junior engineer specializing in designing radar systems, he quickly became a program manager, went through the supervisory ranks, eventually became director of engineering, then vice-president, and then president of Gilfillan. Three years before he left the firm, ITT bought Gilfillian and it became one of the 250 ITT companies.

After 19 years with the firm, Burt left to concentrate on building his educational products company, which publishes and manufactures

600 line items that cover all disciplines taught in elementary through junior high school. Products include manipulative aids, reading materials, records, tapes, and a number of electronic aids.

One of his electronic aids, GeoSafari, is sold worldwide and is one of the biggest selling electronic learning devices used in both school and the home. Endorsed by National Geographic, it teaches geography and other subjects in a challenging game which can be played by one or two persons or by teams.

Since Burt has gone into semiretirement, his son has become president of the company and his wife serves as vice president.

In private life, Burt is the father of three children and the grandfather of seven, all of whom live in Southern California. For relaxation, he enjoys playing golf and tennis.
