Inserting a Picture into a Slide

- On the *Insert* tab:
 - Click on *Picture*; in dialog box, go to the file location of desired picture; double-click on it
 - Center and size picture as needed; drag from corner
- To Frame picture: on the *Home* tab (or on the *Picture Tools** tab above the *Format* tab):
 - Click on *Shape Outline* (or *Picture Border**); in dialog box:
 - Choose *Color* of frame; then *Weight* of frame (6 pt)
- For descriptive Text Box: on the *Insert* tab:
 - Click on *Text Box*; Cursor then inserts text box wherever you want
 - Adjust font and size of text from *Font* dialog box on *Home* tab, if necessary

Inserting Video into a Slide

- There are two ways of accomplishing this:
- With connection to the Internet: insert link; clip will play from Internet
 - Advantages: Quicker; less memory necessary
 - Disadvantages: Network problems; clip may be taken down and no longer available; you may have to view advertisements
- No Internet connection: download clip
 - Advantages: No network problems; always available, because it is in your possession
 - Disadvantages: Not as quick, takes more memory

Inserting Internet Link into a Slide

- Copy URL of the video clip onto your clipboard
- Insert “Developer” into the ribbon
 - Under file, click “Options,” then “Customize Ribbon”; check “Developer”; click “OK”
- Click “Developer” and then “tools”
 - Create and size window for the clip on a new blank slide
 - Right-click in that window; left-click “Properties”
- In the form that appears, paste clip URL into the space for “movie”
 - Alter the URL in two ways:
 - Delete “watch?”
 - Replace equal sign after “v” with “/”
 - After “loop,” replace “true” with “false”
 - After “playing,” replace “true” with “false”
- Close the form and check to see that video clip plays in response to a click

Inserting Video Clip into a Slide

- Has gotten considerably easier after PowerPoint 2007
 - YouTube clips now download as .mpeg4 files
 - Inserted into '10 & '13 PowerPoint slides, they will play
 - Many apps download Video Clips; *RealPlayer Cloud (Free)*
 - *Windows Movie Maker* will edit, if clip is too long
- **Critical:** After clip is downloaded:
 - Move clip to the **same folder** in which PP slides reside!
 - If clip won't play and title is long, may wish to shorten it
- On the **Insert** tab:
 - Click on **Movie** icon; in dialog box, go to the file location of desired video file; double-click on it
 - Choose **Automatically** or **When Clicked**
 - Size film clip as desired (click & drag corner)
 - Watch for pixilation problem if you enlarge excessively!

Inserting Music into a Slide

- Different Effects Are Possible
 - Play music on just one slide
 - Play more than one piece of music on one slide
 - Play music that continues through several slides
- Critical to all of these, however:
 - Move music clip into the **same folder** in which PowerPoint slides reside!
 - If music clip won't play and title is long, may wish to shorten it

To Play Music on Just One Slide

- On the *Insert* tab:
 - Click on *Sound* icon
 - In dialog box, go to the file location of desired file (in .wav or .wma); double-click on it
 - .mp3 format will not play, but *RealPlayer* will burn .wav or .wma; iTunes can create AAC version
- Choose either '*Automatically*' or '*When Clicked*'
- Drag loudspeaker icon to corner; can hide it during show (if you aren't clicking on it)

To Play Multiple Pieces of Music on One Slide, Automatically

- Insert 1st piece of music as just described
- Insert 2nd piece of music, etc.
- Open Animation Pane
 - Click on 1st piece of music; then
 - Click on arrow on the Right for drop-down menu
 - On drop-down menu, click *“Start After Previous”*
 - Repeat for each piece of music in turn
- Can also choose to click on pieces in turn, in the order listed in Animation Pane

To Play Same Music Through Several Slides

- Click on *Transitions* tab*, then on “No Sound” window after *Sound* (drop-down menu)
 - Choose *Other Sound* on drop-down menu; in dialog box, go to file location of desired file & double-click on it
 - To stop music: go to same “No Sound” window
 - Choose [*Stop Previous Sound*] on drop-down menu
- *On earlier versions of PP, Click on *Animations* tab; then on *Transition Sound*

Remember:

- On earlier versions of PP:
- Inserted Music and Video Clips may not play if their titles are longer than 2-3 words!

Choosing a Background

- Click the *Office Button*; then click *New*
- Under *Templates*, click:
 - *Installed Templates*, and choose one you like;
or
 - *Installed Themes*, and choose one you like
- Under *Microsoft Office Online*:
 - Click *Presentations*; then click *Academic*,
Business, *Design Slides with Content*, etc.
 - Click *Design Slides*;
 - Click *More Categories*; etc.

Another Way to View Installed Themes

- On the *Design* tab:
 - Sample the themes to see if you like one
 - In *Background* group, click *Background Styles*; then if you like, click *Format Background*
- Open *Format Background* dialog box; explore:
 - *Solid Fill* (different colors);
 - *Gradient Fill* (different color, type, direction, and effects);
 - *Texture Fill* (different textures); and *Picture Fill* (with pictures of yours); see my example
- You can also explore using different *Colors*, *Fonts*, and *Effects*

Custom Animations: One-at-a-time Bullets, Fading in

- Highlight all bullets on selected slide
- On *Animations* tab, click on *Animation Pane*
- On R, click *Add Animation* (pull-down menu)
- Under *Entrance*, click *Fade* on resulting pull-down menu
- While bullets are highlighted (Animation Pane):
 - On R, click arrowhead (open menu)(affects all)
 - Click *Start On Click* > sequential #'s
 - Click on *Play* (upper L); preview insertion of bullets

Custom Animations: Darkening Bullets after Use

- In Animation Pane:
 - Highlight all bullets but the last bullet
 - On R, click arrowhead (open menu)
 - Click ***Effect Options***; in resulting box, next to ***After Animation***, click arrowhead (open menu)
 - choose desired color from resulting menu; click ***OK***
 - Click on ***Play*** (upper L); preview darkening of bullets

Custom Animations: Insertion of Animated Arrow

- To form arrow:
 - On ***Insert*** tab, click ***Shapes*** (open pull-down menu)
 - Choose single-headed arrow under ***Lines***
 - Cursor becomes drawing tool; draw arrow where and as desired
 - To change arrow color/weight:
 - Click on ***Drawing Tools*** (above ***Format*** tab)
 - Above ***Shape Styles***, click on arrowhead (to open menu)
 - Sample different possibilities; choose desired one

Custom Animations: Insertion of Animated Arrow (continued)

- To move arrow: click on arrow (highlight it)
 - On *Animations* tab, click on *Add Animation*
 - On pull-down menu, go to *Motion Paths* or *More Motion Paths*
 - Choose the motion path you want
 - Set to start *On Click* (if not already so set)
- Speed of motion path also can be set: choose action in Animation Pane; click on arrow (open menu); click on *Timing*
 - Click on *Play* (upper L); preview animated arrow

Custom Animations: Some More Things You Can Do...

- Choose picture or shape you'd like to animate
- On *Animations* tab, click on *Add Animation*
 - Under *Entrance*, click and explore other effects on resulting pull-down menu
 - Point to *Emphasis*, and click *Grow/Shrink* or *Spin*
 - Point to *Motion Paths*, and explore possibilities, click *More Motion Paths*, or *Draw Custom Path...*
 - Click on *Play* (upper L) to preview your animations
