

If you miss a meeting or arrive late, be responsible for finding out what you missed.


Sign up for a training session (to be announced soon) to improve your coordination and/or presentation skills.

### **OMNILORE PROFILES**

John Taber - President Elect

John Taber is one of those rare finds on the California landscape - a native son. Born in Burbank, he received his bachelor's degree in electrical engineering from California Institute of Technology and his masters at the University of California at Berkeley.

He spent the last thirty seven (37) years of his working career as an electronic engineer with TRW, beginning with them in the early years when they were still known as Ramo Wooldrige. He served in the capacity of project manager throughout most of his career until his retirement two years ago.

While employed at TRW, John served for almost a decade with AGARD (Advanced Group for Aeronautical Research and Development) for NATO, traveling throughout Europe exchanging technical information with representatives of other NATO countries.

Fifteen years ago he decided to build his own house. It took him

two years to complete the home in Rolling Hills Estates in which he currently dwells.

A member of the American Rocket Society and Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers, John worked at TRW on the LANDSAT program (the satellite that collects images of the earth for peaceful purposes). In recognition of his achievements in this endeavor, he was awarded the NASA Medal for Exceptional Scientific Achievement.

As a member of the original **OMNILORE** group since 1990, John was instrumental in the formation of the current organization a year ago. The five achievements of which he is proudest are his five adult children -- two daughters: one an attorney and the other an administrator at TRW, and three sons: a high school teacher, a doctoral candidate in economics at the University of Chicago and a television technician currently studying for his degree in Phoenix.
