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# STEM CELL RESEARCH TO BE TOPIC OF JANUARY 30TH FORUM

Dr. Carol Ann Itatani, award-winning professor of microbiology at California State University, Long Beach, will be guest speaker at an *Omnilore* forum luncheon to be held Wednesday, January 30th, at the Los Verdes Country Club, 7000 W. Los Verdes Drive, Rancho Palos Verdes at 11:30 a.m.

Her topic will be *Stem Cells: Modern Miracle or Moral Menace?* Her talk will probe the basics of what stem cells are, their potential uses and ethics involved in their use and application.

Author of two books and several articles in publications dealing with stem cell research, Dr. Itantani holds awards for Meritorious Performance and Professional Promise as well as Outstanding Teacher and Faculty Member.

Cost of the luncheon will be \$15. Reservation deadline is January 21st.

# OMNILORE PROFILE - GRANT LANEY, CURRICULUM CHAIRMAN

When Grant Laney was a little boy growing up in Phoenix, Arizona, there was a pretty little girl, Patti, living across the street; but they never met. Through the years their parents met frequently at the home of mutual friends; but Grant and Patti never crossed paths. It wasn't until he was a student at Arizona State University that Grant's fraternity brother introduced him to a couple who turned out to be Patti's parents—and Grant finally met Patti. After working together for a couple of years on a committee arranging the college's annual homecoming dance, Grant Laney and Patti Boerger fell in love, became engaged, and set a wedding date for December 1955.

Wedding plans were put on hold when upon graduation in June 1955 Grant, who had served in the ROTC at college, was commissioned as a second lieutenant in the Air Force. After working a summer job with a surveying crew for an engineering firm, he was called to active duty that September. While serving in Korea, Grant courted Patti by phone, rescheduled the wedding for October 6, 1956, and completed wedding plans by telephone.

The wedding took place while he was on leave between assignments. newlyweds bought a new green and white Chevy Bel Air and drove across the country to Tyndall Air Force Base in Panama City, Florida on the Gulf Coast. The first of their four children was born there. Upon his release from military service in August, 1957 the Laneys drove to Los Angeles County where they stayed with Patti's brother's family while Grant, who had a B.A. degree in mathematics, looked for a job in software programming in the aircraft industry. He was hired by Douglas Aircraft which was located at the time in their original hangar on the grounds of Santa Monica Airport.

During the four years that he worked at Douglas, Grant—who had taken no computer science courses in college—received on-the-job computer training during the day and studied electronics engineering at night. After receiving the equivalent of a bachelors degree in electronic engineering and passing the graduate record exam, Grant began taking graduate courses in electronic engineering—only to discover that he actually preferred programming to

engineering. He worked in programming in various capacities from the fall of 1957 through the summer of 1998 when he retired from N.C.R.

In their retirement, Grant and Patti (a retired teacher) have been volunteer tutors at a Catholic school in Watts. Patti tutors grades K-1 and Grant tutors upper grade math. In addition, he tutors private students in math.

In 1976 Grant and Patti participated in a marriage encounter weekend. After the weekend ended, the Laneys were invited to conduct marriage encounter weekends. Together with a priest and two other couples, they conducted 50 marriage encounter weekends until the early nineties.

After purchasing a new piano a couple of years ago, Grant began practicing the Rachmoninoff second concerto in preparation to play the piano solo accompaniment to an orchestra recording on special CD's called Music Minus One.

The Laneys have four grown children—two sons and two daughters.
