

#### Carol Johnson to Head "Virtual Office"

The Omnilore Virtual Office is a term coined by Administrative Vice President Bob Grove to refer to the distributed set of computers, people, equipment and supplies that are involved in the paperwork that makes **Omnilore** function. Carol Johnson has been appointed as the first Virtual Office manager. After gathering lists of at least 48 Omnilore



documents and 18 people who make or have made them, Carol held a Virtual Office meeting at the Knob Hill facility to pool information and discuss ideas. Fifteen of the persons involved participated.

Profiles collected by Carol show that among us, five Omnilorians use Macs (including the one at Knob Hill) and 10 use PCs, of which eight have Windows 98. Two people use Word Perfect, 12 use MS Word, and 12 have MS Excel for spreadsheets. Six have zip drives and one has a writeable CD drive. All have email and web access, with the exception of two of the Macs. According to Carol, "It is unclear whether e-mail attachments can be passed between various combinations of computers, operating systems, applications and their various versions, and Internet Service Providers (ISP)."

The group discussed future plans. Several members want to use one another's files, particularly the membership roster and class rosters. However, the group has not solved the portability problem between Macs and PCs and even between different applications and versions of applications. They discussed the possibility of having a www.omnilore.org website which would tell what **Omnilore** is and how to join, and might let members choose study/discussion topics.

According to Carol, the committee is well aware that some Omnilorians do not use computers, so manual methods of communication will continue to be maintained. Interested members are invited to contact Carol with their ideas about the Omnilore Virtual Office.

#### **OMNILORE PROFILE – LES BERG – SECRETARY**

Although he was born in Minneapolis (just a mile west of Minnehaha Falls of Longfellow fame), Les Berg considers himself a country boy. At the age of two his family moved to a farm in a remote area in Northern Wisconsin. From the time he was two until he was nine, his major pastime was walking in the woods. The farm was located three and one-half miles from the rural school and 10 miles from town.

When he was nine the family moved to a home within two and one-half miles from a town of 400 where he had neighbors across the road. After four years in these semi-rural surroundings, the family returned to Minneapolis when his father took a job with a defense plant.

A week after graduation from high school in 1946, Les entered the Army Air Force where he spent 15 months as a cryptographer, stationed part of the time in Okinawa. He entered the University of Minnesota in the Spring of 1947 where he majored in economics and minored in political science. Thanks to receiving credit for studies he had undertaken while in the service, he graduated just two years later, receiving his bachelor of science degree in June, 1949.

After working in procurement at Wright

-Patterson Air Force Base in Dayton, Ohio, Les moved to El Segundo where he served as a contracting officer on the Thor missile for the Air Force Space and Missile Division. In 1962 he relocated to Houston, Texas to serve as chief of procurement for the Gemini program at NASA for a four-month stint.

Returning to California, he served on the staff of the director of contracts at North American Aviation, Autonetics Division, in Anaheim. While living in north Tustin, he attended Cal State Fullerton and was awarded his MBA degree in 1969.

Shortly thereafter he transferred to Hughes Helicopters in Culver City where he remained for 17 years, during which time they changed their name to McDonnell Douglas Helicopters. When the division moved to Mesa, Arizona, Les retired. Subsequently, he emerged from retirement to accept a position as contract administrator at Magnavox, where he remained for six years until he retired permanently in 1992.

He has resided in north Redondo Beach ever since his marriage to Jackie in 1982. Les currently serves as board president of the South Bay Unitarian Fellowship in Redondo Beach and is a board member of his home-owners

association. A member of **Omnilore** for six and a half years, Les was elected secretary at the October annual meeting.

Through the years he has been an ardent stamp collector and an amateur gardener. He grows epiphylums and begonias. In addition, he works out regularly at the gym. A genealogy buff, he has already catalogued over 250 family members on his computer. His other hobby is the stock market.

Despite health problems involving his eyes which resulted in several surgeries at the Jules Stein Institute, Les is an avid elderhosteler, concentrating on offerings California and Arizona.

This summer he and Jackie look forward to a trip to Massachusetts where they will attend the college graduation of Jackie's granddaughter.




