Religious Right Discussed By Speaker At Annual Meeting

A youthful grandmother of seven, so enthusiastic about her subject that she loses her place in her notes, was Carole Shields, three-year national president of People of the American Way, key speaker at OMNILORE's Annual Meeting.

Terming the religious right a "robust political juggernaut," she alerted the more than 100 members attending the October 21st Torrance Hilton luncheon "they have set their sights on the Republicans - moving the party to the right. Moderate party members are being replaced."



Ms. Shields explained educational, judicial and legislative all are their targets. "Teaching creationism is preferred to the concepts of evolution, books are being censored or removed from schools," she warned, adding that freedom-shackling reproductive rights and Christian-only slanted religious teachings are wide-spread.

"They are eviscerating the First Amendment," she said. The Supreme Court remains divided: four moderate, four conservative, with Sandra Day O'Connor as the deciding factor.

"Tyranny is back in our vocabulary," she warned. "Look around and see what policies are moving." She pointed out that while "most Americans don't agree with the religious right" we are not as "mobilized" as they.

Her solution: "Get the message out to the young. Help them know the issues." In addition she urged attention to getting vacant judicial offices filled before President Clinton leaves office to maintain a liberalconservative balance.

"Pick good candidates for political office. Stand by them. Be the constituency that backs them up." she advised.


After meeting Robert Koch at her retirement dinner in 1987, she married him in June 1991.
